

Packaging methods and shipping restrictions

We want to ensure that your shipments reach the destination in perfect condition. Before a shipment is processed, it is the responsibility of each client to verify that the items in the parcel are properly packaged.

Labeling parcels with "Fragile" does not replace a proper packaging.
 Recommendations and packaging solutions for preparing shipments.

- Choose the size and type of packaging depending on the shipment's contents;
- To prevent the shipment contents' movement during transport, make sure you use enough protective material;
- Place fragile goods in the centre of the package and make sure items are not in direct contact with each other;
- When applying tape onto closed cardboard boxes, apply tape across the top side once and across the lateral sides twice in order to ensure support. The heavier the parcel, the more tape is needed.

You will find below a list of objects, which can be transported through the URGENT CARGUS network, that we consider fragile. They can be accepted for shipping only if the client respects the recommended packaging.

For objects other than those specified in the table, please note that they must be packaged as compactly as possible and the packaging must comply with the following conditions:

- exterior - strong enough that it does not give in due to the contents' weight;
- interior - filled with protective material that does not allow movement of contents.
